No. 351. Along roadside, across river from Santa Fe. Plants small, vetch-like, growing in dense patches; flowers yellow; roots with nodules. Dec. 3, 1947.

161859. ADESMIA sp.

No. 43. Along roadside, above Goya, Corrientes. Plants dense, prostrate, 6 to 10 inches high, resembling vetch in habit. Dec. 6, 1947.

161860. ADESMIA sp.

No. 69. Along road, 11 km. south of San José on road to Concepción del Uruguay. Plant prostrate, vetchlike, viny. Dec. 17, 1947.

161861. ADESMIA sp.

No. 67. Cultivated, La Plata Experimental Station. Vetchlike. Nov. 30, 1947.

161862. AESCHYNOMENE MONTEVIDENSIS Vog. Fabaceae.

No. 71. In swampy soil near the Parana River, 100 km. north of Buenos Aires. Semishrub, 8 to 12 feet tall. Dec. 18, 1947.

161863 to 161865. ARACHIS VILLOSA Benth. Fabaceae.

161863. No. 45. River-bottom land of Rio Empedrado, on road from Bella Vista to Corrientes. Plants prostrate, somewhat hirsute; taproot large and tuberous. Dec. 6, 1947.

161864. No. 48. Along bottom land of river, 20 km. south of Corrientes. Dec. 8, 1947. Plants small, glabrous, with carrotlike taproot about 1 inch thick.

161865. No. 49. In fine sandy soil interspersed with lime sinks of small lakes, between San Cosme and Ramada Paso, Corrientes. Plants prostrate, with large taproots; pods usually one-seeded. Dec. 9, 1947.

161866 to 161869. ARACHIS HYPOGAEA L. Fabaceae. Common peanut.

161866 to 161868. *Mani Blanca*. Warehouse, Cayasta, Santa Fe. Cultivated extensively for oil. Dec. 3, 1947.

161871 and 161872. DESMODIUM spp. Fabaceae.**161871. DESMODIUM CANUM (Gmel.) Schinz & Thell.**

No. 50. Near San Javier, Misiones. Widely distributed in northern Argentina; plants usually not more than 30 cm. high. Dec. 13, 1947.

161872. DESMODIUM sp.

No. 42. Thirty km. north of Bella Vista, Corrientes. Widely distributed in Corrientes. Plants prostrate, viny; panicles erect, up to 30 cm. long. Dec. 5, 1947.
