A bushy annual with ascending stems 1 to 2 feet high. Native to tropical Asia.

189493. *ALYSICARPUS VAGINALIS* var. *NUMMULARIFOLIUS* (L.) Baker.

A stout tufted legume with stems 1 to 2 feet long. Native to India.

189494. *HEYLANDIA LATEBROSA* (L.) DC. Fabaceae.

A prostrate, much-branched, silky pubescent leguminous herb. Native to tropical Asia.

189495. *INDIGOFERA CORDIFOLIA* Roth. Fabaceae.

A bushy annual with stems 3 to 9 inches long. Native to India.

189496. *INDIGOFERA GLANDULOSA* Willd.

An annual with slender elongated branches. Native to western India.

189497. *INDIGOFERA LINIFOLIA* Retz.

A copiously branched, silvery pubescent annual with slender stems 6 inches to 1 foot long, and bright-red flowers in dense racemes. Native throughout India.
