- 232152.** No. 23. Along shore, Lake Tahoe, Placer County, California. Plants abundant.
- 232153.** No. 32. Meadow 4 miles west of Portola, Plumas County, California. Elevation 4,850 feet. Plants robust.
- 232154.** No. 37. Scattered 3 miles south of Fort Klamath, Fort Creek Motel, Route 62, Klamath County, Oregon. Elevation 5,500 feet. Plants to 3 feet high.
- 232155.** No. 100. Edge of draw in rabbit-brush meadow, Route 11 between Elko and Tuscarora, Elko County, Nevada. Elevation 7,000 feet. Plants to 4 feet high, scattered.
- 232156.** No. 117. Dry exposed slope, Lamoille Canyon, Elko County, Nevada. Elevation 7,000 feet. Plants to 13 inches high; depauperate.
- 232157.** No. 120. Marshy meadow, east side Humboldt Range, 3 miles southwest of Boaz, road from Wells, Elko County, Nevada. Plants to 3 feet high, stand dense; good seeders.
- 232158.** No. 125. Above Trappist Monastery, top of Wasatch Range, near Huntsville, Utah, Route 39. Elevation 8,500 feet. Plant associated with balsam roots; spikes 5 inches long, glabrous.
- 232159.** No. 128. Above Trappist Monastery, Wasatch Range, near Huntsville, Weber County, Utah. Plants abundant.
- 232160.** No. 132. Road to Snow Basin near Huntsville, Weber County, Utah. Plants to 3.5 feet high, drouth resistant; spikes to 6 inches long.
- 232161.** No. 143. Ranger's pasture, Manila, Daggett County, Utah. One clump, 4 feet high; spikes to 8 inches long; leaves high on stem, broad.
- 232162.** No. 145. Sheeps Creek Canyon (Ashley National Forest), between Manila and Vernal, Daggett County, Utah. Plants non-stoloniferous, abundant.
- 232163.** No. 146. Sandy hillside, Death Valley Canyon, 1 mile north of Tower Rock (Ashley National Forest), Daggett County, Utah. Elevation 8,000 feet. Plants to 4 feet high; spikes to 7 inches long; leaves up to spike.
- 232164.** No. 158. Yellow pine grove east of Elk Creek and west of Little Elk Creek (Ashley National Forest), Daggett County, Utah. Foliage abundant; spikes to 6 inches long.
- 232165.** No. 169. Ten miles west of Trappers Lake, Route 132, White River Valley, Rio Blanco County, Colorado. Plants to 3 feet high.
- 232166.** No. 173. Grassy slope, Trappers Lake, Garfield County, Colorado. Plants to 2 feet high.
- 232167.** No. 178. Scattered in rocky clearing, surrounded by aspen and Colorado spruce, 20 miles south of Buford on New Castle Road, Garfield County, Colorado. Elevation 8,500 feet. Plants to 1.5 feet high; spikes to 5 inches long.
- 232168.** No. 181. Thirty-two miles north of New Castle, road to Buford, Garfield County, Colorado. Elevation 10,000 feet. Plants to 1.5 feet high, very glaucous.
- 232169.** No. 191. Among shrub oaks and serviceberry, on sandy hillside, 20 miles south of Silt, on the Grand Mesa, Mesa County, Colorado. One plant collection.
- 232170.** No. 198. Mesa Lake, Grand Mesa, Mesa County, Colorado. Robust plant with spike 5 inches long; heavy seeder.
