247312. MYROTHAMNUS FLABELLIFOLIA Welw. Myrothamnaceae.

From South West Africa. Plants collected by Louis Williams, agricultural explorer, New Crops Research Branch, Crops Research Division, Beltsville, Maryland. Received May 5, 1958.

Col. No. 21591. 'Resurrection Plant'. Dry rocky hills about 15 miles southeast of Usazos. A curious plant; the dried leaves will open in about 24 hours after being wet.

247313. CAMELLIA sp. Theaceae.

From Nepal. Cuttings presented by the United States Operations Mission, Katmandu. Received May 5, 1958.

Collected by Capt. Aditya at 2,500 feet elevation. Climate much like that of the lower Mississippi area. Well drained acid soil.

247314. MALUS SYLVESTRIS Mill. Malaceae. Common apple.

From France. Scions presented by the Lambertin Nurseries, Nimes (Gard). Received April 18, 1958.

'Frequin Lacaille'. Cider apple, cultivated for 60 years by Mr. Lecaille, Frischemesnil, Normandy.

From Colombia. Seeds and tubers collected by D. S. Correll, collaborator, New Crops Research Branch, Crops Research Division, Beltsville, Md. Received April 18, 1958.

Received as tubers, unless otherwise noted.

247315. DIGITALIS PURPUREA L. Scrophulariaceae. Common foxglove.

Col. No. Co-463. Quebrada San Francisco, east of Bogota. Flowers large, reddish to white. (Seeds.)

247316. GOSSYPIMUM sp. Malvaceae.

Col. No. Co-465. Hillsides, 1 km. south of Quebrada de Vera, road from Malaga to Soata, Santander. Plants to 4.5 meters high; flower yellow with red splotch at base. Bolls very small. (Seeds.)

247317. ILEX sp. Aquifoliaceae.

Col. No. Co-514. Near Totoro, Cauca. Broad-leaved evergreen tree or large shrub with yellow fruits. (Seeds.)

247318. IPOMOEA sp. Convolvulaceae.

Col. No. Co-479. Market, Pasto, Marino. Roots round or fusiform; skin reddish-purple; flesh white.

247319. SOLANUM ANDREANUM Baker Solanaceae.

Col. No. Co-487. About 18 km. from Pasto, road to La Union, Narino. Elevation 2,900 meters. Plant simple or bushy; fruit round-ovoid, 2 cm. long; flowers purplish with darker stripes on back, rotate-stellate; tubers ellipsoid to 3 cm. long.

247320 to 247322. SOLANUM COLOMBIANUM Dunal

247320. Col. No. Co-498. Field near Encano, Narino. Elevation 3,100 meters. Plants spreading, branched; flowers white; fruits ovoid, to 3 cm. long. (Seeds.)

247321. Col. No. Co-500. Quebrada 15 km. from Pasto, road to San Francisco and Mocoa. Elevation 3,200 meters. Plants large, bushy; branches to 8 feet long; fruits ovoid, ellipsoid to 3 cm. long (Seeds.)

247322. Col. No. Co-525. Paramo 27 km. from Purace, Cauca. Plants large, bushy; flowers white, rotate-stellate; fruits ovoid-ellipsoid to 3 cm. long; no tubers found. (Seeds.)
