Col. No. 103. Fazenda Catango, near Urucuca, Bahia. Typical 'Comun' or 'Amelonado' cacao but without red pigment in new leaves. Cotyledons are pure white if self-pollinated; may be purple if crossed. Seeds from five trees.

Col. No. 17564. Consuma, east of Firenze, Italy. Elevation 2,700 feet.

251799. TRIFOLIUM LIGUSTICUM Balb. Fabaceae.

Shrubs died in 1956.
