

401754 and 401755. ZEA MAYS L. Gramineae. Corn.

From United States. Seed presented May 1971 by C. E. Hanson, Jr., Director, Museum of Fur Trade, Chadron, Nebraska. Reproduced by Regional Plant Introduction Station, Ames, Iowa. Received March 13, 1975.

401754. A-1394. 'Seneca Hominy Corn'. Obtained 1968 from Nettie Watt, Steamburg, New York, a member of Seneca tribe. Flint type having small ears, blue and white kernels. Typical of corn described as "old-time hominy corn."

401755. A-1395. Sioux Tribe, Pine Ridge Reservation, Oglala, South Dakota. White flour corn obtained 1967 from Hobart Bissonette, an Oglala Sioux. Family grown for generations. Ear slender, about 23 cm long. May have come from along the Missouri River.

From Austria. Seed presented May 1958 by Food and Agriculture Organization, United Nations Office, Gleisdorf. Reproduced by Regional Plant Introduction Station, Ames, Iowa. Received March 13, 1975.

A-1400. 'Steirischer Kleinkorniger Rundmais'.

401757 and 401758. ZEA MAYS L. Corn.

From United States. Seed presented February 1972 by R. W. Briggs, Funk Brothers Seed Company, Bloomington, Illinois. Reproduced by Regional Plant Introduction Station, Ames, Iowa. Received March 13, 1975.

401757. A-1417. 'Gaspe Flint'.

401758. A-1418. 'Fuller'.

401759. ZEA MAYS L. Corn.

From United States. Seed presented December 1973 by R. L. Johnston, Jr., Johnny's Selected Seeds, North Dixmont, Maine. Reproduced by Regional Plant Introduction Station, Ames, Iowa. Received March 13, 1975.

A-1448. Bulk sample with red kernels designated as 'King Philip' and yellow kernels as 'Longfellow'. Flint type reportedly held by Comstock family, Alstead, New Hampshire, at least 50 years. Selected for earliness every year. Matures in about 85 days, usually planted in June, harvested early September. Both kernel colors are planted.

From United States. Seed presented May 1972 by A. F. Troyer, Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Mankato, Minnesota. Reproduced by Regional Plant Introduction Station, Ames, Iowa. Received March 13, 1975.

A-1421. 'Manitoba Yellow Flint'. Pioneer Hi-Bred, Willmar, Minnesota. More productive than most varieties of this maturity. Variety developed by Professor W. Southworth, Manitoba Agricultural College, Canada, in 1924.
