452058. A-1824. Heid's Yellow Dent. United States. Dixon, Illinois. Wilmer Gerdes, R R 2. Tom Kevern, Dept. of Agron., Iowa State Univ., Ames. Collected April 25, 1978. Ears with 20 paired rows. Kernels deep, heavy butts. Also known as 'Worlds Fair'. Cultivated. Seed.
452059. A-1825. Yellow Jellicorse. United States. Univ. of Tennessee, Knoxville. L.M. Josephson, Dept. of Plant and Soil Science. Collected May 02, 1978. Originally from South Africa. Seeds yellow flint. Cultivated. Seed.
452060. A-1848. Cow corn. United States. Univ. of Tennessee, Knoxville. L.M. Josephson, Dept. of Plant and Soil Science. Collected February 05, 1979. South Carolina. Seeds long narrow, white dent. Ears 5 or 6 per plant, harvested before pollination for tenderness and pickled. Also called 'South Carolina Cow Corn' and 'Georgia Cow Corn'. Cultivated. Seed.

452061. A-1789. Black Beauty. United States. Alberta, Minnesota. E. H. Strubbe. Collected April 18, 1977. Black popcorn. Cobs to 12cm long. Garden favorite around 1920's. Cultivated. Seed.
452062. A-1790. United States. Alberta, Minnesota. E. H. Strubbe. Red popcorn. Cobs to 10cm long, red. Segregates for short, thick ears, and long slim ears. Probably a mixture of 'Garnet' and 'Red Beauty'. Popular in 1920's and 30's. Cultivated. Seed.
452063. A-1791. Golden Australian Hulless. United States. Alberta, Minnesota. E. H. Strubbe. Collected April 18, 1977. Yellow popcorn. Cobs to 7cm, white. Seeds obtained in early 1930's from Burgess Seed Co., Galesburg, Michigan. Cultivated. Seed.
452064. A-1792. Pinky Popcorn. United States. Alberta, Minnesota. E. H. Strubbe. Collected April 18, 1977. Pink popcorn. Cobs to 10cm long, white. Variety developed in 1930's and originally obtained from O.H. Will Seed Co., Bismarck, ND.
