

1893. IPOMOEA SIDAEOFOLIA.**Morning glory.**

A rapid grower, producing a fine effect when in flower; one of the most beautiful of the family.

1894. PITHECOLOBIUM SAMAN.**Rain tree.**

From France. Received through Mr. W. T. Swingle, December, 1898. (2 packages.)

1895. TIPUANA SPECIOSA.

From France. Received through Mr. W. T. Swingle, December, 1898. (5 packages.)

A tree reaching 20 m. (60 feet) high, of extremely rapid growth. It is injured by a temperature of 4° C. (25° F.).

1896. MEDICAGO ARBOREA.**Tree medic.**

1897. MELIANTHUS MAJOR.

A native of the Cape, 2½ m. (7½ feet) high, the foliage fine; a honey plant (?).

1898. MELICocca BIJUGA.**Jenip.**

Tropical edible fruit.

1899. MUSA ENSETE.**Abyssinian banana.**

A fine ornamental plant, grown only from seed, unusually hardy; stem 2½ m. (7½ feet); leaves 2.5 by .6 m. (7½ by 2 feet).
