



ARBOR VITÆ (THUJA ORIENTALIS L.) IN SHENSI, CHINA. (SEE S. P. I. No. 38798.)

A single specimen of conical form, called by the Chinese *Weng pai shu*, meaning "water-jar conifer," referring to its outlines, which seem to resemble certain types of water jars. Of value as an evergreen for cemeteries and for places of dignity. Especially suited to mild-wintered semiarid climes. (Photographed by Frank N.
