



FRUITING BRANCHES OF A RECENTLY INTRODUCED CHINESE PRINSEPIA (*PRINSEPIA UNIFLORA*). (SEE S. P. I. NO. 39432.)

This dry-land spiny shrub should be adapted to the extremes of drought and cold of the Great Plains area and the extreme Southwest. Its fruits are dark red in color and vary a good deal in size and in degree of acidity and amount of pulp. It is probably capable of considerable improvement by selection. (Photographed by Frank N.
