



AN INTERESTING HARDY CITRUS FRUIT FROM KANSU, CHINA (CITRUS SP., S. P. I. Nos. 39897 AND 40039).

A peculiar loose-skinned fruit with light yellow rind, agreeable sharp-sour taste and lemon odor. The trees are thrifty and apparently prolific. This species is found at altitudes of 2,000 to 4,500 feet in a region where persimmons, figs, pomegranates, walnuts, and pears are cultivated. Photographed by Frank N.
