



A TALL-GROWING GOOSEBERRY FROM KANSU, CHINA (*RIBES ALPESTRE GIGANTEUM*,
S. P. I. Nos. 39916 and 40022).

A remarkably spiny tall wild gooseberry, growing at altitudes of 7,000 to 9,000 feet in the Province of Kansu. Suitable as a hedge plant. The berries are elongated, of medium size, and hang on the bush throughout most of the winter. These fruits are preserved by American missionaries and make a delicious tart jam.
