



A WEEPING FORM OF THE CHINESE ELM, *ULMUS PUMILA* L. (SEE S. P. I. No. 40507.)

The extreme hardiness of this Chinese elm, which has been widely distributed throughout our Northwestern States, will make this picturesque weeping form, which is a rare variety even in China, particularly welcome in that region for use in cemeteries and parks.
