



A BASKETFUL OF PREMIER JELLY PRODUCERS, FRUITS OF THE ROSELLE PLANT. (HIBISCUS SABDARIFFA L., S. P. I. No. 42473.)

Only a part of the fruit is used, the thick fleshy calyx, the juice of which has a beautiful wine-red color and makes an excellent jelly or jam with a flavor somewhat resembling that of the cranberry, but which is perhaps more delicate.
