



THE WILD CHERRY OF GUATEMALA. (*PRUNUS SALICIFOLIA* H. B. K., S. P. I. No. 43425.)

The cereza, or wild cherry, is common in the highlands of Mexico and Central America. Its fruits are of pleasant flavor and almost as large as some of the cultivated cherries of temperate regions. Because of its adaptability to subtropical conditions this species merits introduction into the southern United States and similar regions.
