



THE GRANADILLA OF GUATEMALA. (*PASSIFLORA LIGULARIS* JUSS., S. P. I. NO. 43437.)

Several species of *Passiflora* are commonly known as granadilla in tropical America. The one here shown is grown in the Guatemalan highlands. It is found at high altitudes; hence, it should be sufficiently frost resistant for cultivation in California and Florida. The white juicy pulp is sweet, delicately flavored, and faintly perfumed.
