



THE GREEN SAPOTE, A RARE TROPICAL FRUIT. (*ACHRADELPHA VIRIDIS* (PITTIER)
O. F. COOK, S. P. I. No. 43439.)

The green sapote, or injerto, is found in the Guatemalan highlands. It is much superior in quality to its relative, the sapote or mamey sapote (*Achradelpha mammosa*). The fruits have orange-brown flesh inclosing one or two large seeds; the sweet, rich flavor resembles that of the sapodilla. The tree will probably succeed in Florida and will certainly grow in Porto Rico, Hawaii, and the Philippines.
