



**A GUATEMALAN GIRL HOLDING A CLUSTER OF TUMIN AVOCADOS.**

(*Persea americana* Mill., S. P. I. No. 44627.)

This variety, the Tumin, is now being propagated in Florida and California from bud wood obtained by Mr. Popenoe from the tree which yielded the fruits shown here. The Tumin avocado is unusually productive, its fruits growing in clusters of two to six. These fruits resemble closely in form the Trapp variety, weigh about a pound, and have a smooth, glossy, purple-black skin. They are of good quality.
