



A NEW RELATIVE OF THE AVOCADO, THE GUATEMALAN COYÓ.

(*Persea schiedeana* Nees., S. P. I. No. 44682.)

The coyó, according to Mr. Popenoe, is fully as delicious as the avocado and escaped the search for new fruits until he discovered it at Tactic and sent in cuttings and seeds in 1917. The variety pictured above is said to be very choice. As the tree is tender its cultivation will probably be limited to the tropical zone.
