



THE WHITE SAPOTE, AS IT GROWS IN COSTA RICA. (*CASIMIROA EDULIS*  
LA LLAVE, S. P. I. No. 46375.)

This fruit-bearing tree is commonly cultivated in Mexico and Central America, being particularly esteemed by the inhabitants of Mexico. In recent years it has been grown in California and Florida, where it succeeds admirably. There is much difference among seedling trees in the character of their fruit; that of some is excellent, while that of others is of mawkish or even bitter flavor.
