



A STRIKING SUBSHRUBBY MORNING-GLORY FROM BRAZIL. (IPOMOEA FISTULOSA MART., S. P. I., No. 46966.)

This handsome subshrubby plant is said by Mr. P. H. Dorsett to be a feature of the roadsides around Joazeiro, Brazil. It grows to a height of 8 or 10 feet and produces its lavender-pink flowers in great profusion. The bell-shaped corollas are about 3 inches long. (Photographed by P. H.
