



THE M'BULU, AN EAST AFRICAN SHRUB ALLIED TO THE MOCK ORANGE. (CARDIOGYNE AFRICANA BUREAU, S. P. I. No. 49319.)

This shrub is peculiar to Mozambique. It is usually found as a climber, but often forms a large bush. The fruits, about an inch across and of red-dish yellow color, are said to be edible when fully ripe. The bush is very ornamental when in fruit. (Photographed by Dr. H. L.
