



AN EAST AFRICAN RELATIVE OF THE MANGOSTEEN. (*GARCINIA LIVINGSTONEI* T. ANDERS., S. P. I. No. 49462.)

The munkononga, or mutunguu as the natives call this fruit, is one of the best indigenous fruits of East Africa. The tree is very productive and is itself very ornamental, as are the bright-orange fruits. The flesh of the fruits is juicy, orange colored, and of a delicious sprightly acid flavor.
