



THE ABO, AN AFRICAN ANONA. (*ANNONA SENEGALENSIS* PERS.; S. P. I. NO. 49843.)

This species is said to vary remarkably, some forms being low shrubs not more than 2 or 3 feet in height, like the one shown above, and others trees 30 feet tall. The yellowish or orange-colored fruits, about the size of small apples (2 to 2½ inches across), have a delicious flavor, which makes them very popular with travelers in tropical Africa. If this shrub will bear in southern Florida or California it may become a valuable winter fruit in those regions. (Photographed by Dr. H. L.
