



THE CHAMBURO, AN INTERESTING RELATIVE OF THE PAPAYA. (*CARICA* SP.,

The chamburo is indigenous in the Andes of northern South America and will probably be sufficiently hardy to withstand the winters of southern California and southern Florida.
