



A RED-FRUITED VARIETY OF THE ANDES BERRY. (*RUBUS GLAUCUS*

The Andes berry is one of the most promising fruits of this group introduced from South America, and the berries of the red-fruited variety (which is very rare) have a more delicate flavor than those of the common purplish fruited form.
