



**A RARE SPECIES OF WHITE SAPOTE. (CASIMIROA TETRAMERIA MILLSP.; S. P. I. NO. 55445.)**

When fully ripe, the fruits of this rare white sapote are very soft and delicate in texture and must be handled with care to avoid bruising. They are usually eaten out of the hand and are highly interesting because of the peculiar combination of sweet and bitter flavors which they possess. The tree can be grown in many parts of California and Florida. It resists severe frosts and requires less water than many other fruit trees. (Photographed by E. L.
