



A JUJUBE FOR MOIST TROPICAL REGIONS. (*ZIPHUS MAURITIANA* LAM.; S. P. I. No. 55485.)

The Chinese jujube (*Ziziphus jujuba*) is being cultivated with great success in California and the Southwestern States. It is not successful, however, in southern Florida or in humid tropical regions generally. *Ziziphus mauritiana*, on the other hand, grows and fruits well at the Plant Introduction Garden, Miami, Fla., and will probably be suitable for cultivation in Porto Rico, Hawaii, and the Philippines. It is a small tree of attractive appearance, and its greenish yellow fruits, here illustrated in natural size, when stewed are scarcely distinguishable from the best northern plums.
