A cartload of tubs filled with bean sprouts produced by sprouting the mung bean. These bean sprouts are eaten as a vegetable when scalded, and they are a very tasteful product indeed when served either hot with cut-up meat or cold as a salad with some soybean sauce and vinegar sprinkled over them.
