



A DAVIDIANA PEACH TREE IN CALIFORNIA, *AMYGDALUS DAVIDIANA*, S. P. I. No. 18262.

The great vigor and healthy appearance of this Chinese peach species, which is used as a stock in China, has attracted a great deal of attention among orchardists and nurserymen who have seen the trees, of which the photograph shows one now growing at the Chico Field Station. The tree shown was planted as seed in March, 1906, and is now 20 feet high and has a trunk circumference of 20 inches 1 foot from the ground.
