



THE INJERTO TREE OF GUATEMALA.

(*ACHRADELPHA VIRIDIS* (PITTIER) O. F. COOK, S. P. I. No. 43788.)

The sapote (*Achradelpha mammosa*) has not been a success in Florida or California, but this near relative, which grows at an altitude of 6,000 feet, may stand a better chance of succeeding. It does not come into bearing until it is 8 years old, but it then often produces enormous crops of round to oval fruits, of a dull yellow-green color, a sweet pleasant flavor, and a soft melting texture, which resembles but is better than that of the sapote itself.
