"An entirely distinct variety of the papaya raised in the garden of A. W. Reed, manager of the Western Union Telegraph Co., Brownsville, Tex., said to come from Mexico, and sent to the Office of Foreign Seed and Plant Introduction by Mr. Louis Cobolini, of the Board of City Development, of Brownsville, to whom the fruit was presented.
