



A HARDY DWARF LEMON FROM CHINA.

(*Citrus limonia* Osbeck; S. P. I. No. 23028.)

Frank N. Meyer, Agricultural Explorer of the Bureau of Plant Industry, sent from China in 1908 a dwarf lemon, considered promising for house culture in the United States. Tests in various parts of this country have shown that the variety is not only of value for this purpose but that it is much hardier than the commercial varieties now grown and that its fruit is of excellent quality. Its introduction may, therefore, result in extending the zone in which lemons can be commercially cultivated.
