



**THE BAROUNI OLIVE.**

(*Olea europaea* L.; S. P. I. No. 12569.)

A large-fruited olive secured by Thomas H. Kearney in his exploration of Tunis in 1905. It was famous as the largest olive in that country and occurred almost nowhere except on the place of M. Robert at Kalaa Srira, Susa. It is proving in California to be an excellent variety for processing, either green or ripe, and deserves the serious consideration of olive growers there.
