



THE FUYU KAKI.

(*Diospyros kaki* L. f.; S. P. I. No. 26491.)

Fuyu is one of the most promising varieties of kaki or Japanese persimmon which has been introduced by the Department of Agriculture. It has a rich, sweet, crisp flesh that is never astringent; can be picked, shipped, and eaten while firm and hard like an apple; has a somewhat flattened tomato shape that makes it desirable for shipping; can be grown wherever the other varieties of kaki succeed, and produces good crops.
