



THE CHILEAN STRAWBERRY AS MARKETED IN COLOMBIA.

Throughout the high Andes, from Colombia southward, the Chilean strawberry is esteemed one of the choicest of all fruits. In Colombia, where it is not common, the berries occasionally appear in the Bogota market tied together by their stems to form strings a foot or more in length.
