



ECHEVERIA HOVEYI HORT. (Crassulaceae.) 28673. Plants turned over to the Department for distribution, by Dr. J. N. Rose, Associate Curator, Division of Plants, United States National Museum. Usually stemless, but when old developing a short stem; leaves forming a loose spreading rosette, pale green with broad pinkish or white margins, and these more or less wavy or sometimes colored throughout; flowering stem a second raceme bearing 6 to 12 flowers; corolla pinkish. The origin of this form is unknown, but it is probably some horticultural sport or hybrid but does not closely resemble any of our common cultivated forms, although it may be said to belong to the group of species in which *Echeveria secunda* and *Echeveria glauca* is found.
