



CUDRANIA TRICUSPIDATA.

Fruit of the Chinese Che tree, a near relative of the Osage orange, but with edible fruits, shown in natural size in the photograph. This fruit was grown at the Berckman's Nursery, Augusta, Georgia, from introductions made by Mr. E. H. Wilson, of the Arnold Arboretum, from Central China, but the plant has also been recently found and sent in by Mr. Frank N. Meyer, Agricultural Explorer, from the province of Shantung, in northern China, which has a semi-arid climate with light frosts. The striking similarity between the fruit of this species and the Osage orange suggests the possibility of making a hybrid. Photograph from fruit presented by Mr. P. J.
