A small market basket of jaboticabas, natural size, from the Rio de Janeiro markets. This fruit has become a favorite among Brazilians. The skin is tough like that of a Scuppernong grape and one eats the white fruit pulp much as one would a grape. It has its own distinctive flavor. Photographed by Mr. P. H.
