6426.	<i>CUCUMIS MELO.</i>	Muskmelon.
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Stockholm's Torg. "The best Swedish market variety of cantaloupe. It is here cultivated under glass, and the melons are sold for 2 to 4 kroner, or 50 cents to \$1 apiece." (*Fairchild.*)
