162659. No. 130. *Mani Indio*. Black peanut, very high in oil, from La Estanzuela Experiment Station, Uruguay. Originally from Brazil.

162660. *ARACHIS VILLOSA* Benth.

No. 135. On dry deep, coarse sand along Río de la Plata, Colonia, Uruguay. Jan. 26, 1948. Plants prostrate, spreading; stems 2 feet long; flowers abundant.

162661. *ARACHIS HYPOGAEA* L.

Common peanut.

No. 159. *Mani Colorado*. From Cale, Alexandre and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

162662. *BAUHINIA CANDICANS* Benth. Fabaceae.

No. 185. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Shrub up to 15 feet high with white flowers and heart-shaped leaves.

162663. *BOUTELOUA MEGAPOTAMICA* (Spreng.) Kuntze. Poaceae.

No. 131. Dry rocky hills near Mercedes, Uruguay. Plants small, stoloniferous.

162664. *BROMUS CATHARTICUS* Vahl. Poaceae.

Rescue grass.

No. 158. *Cebadilla Australiana*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

162665. *CICHORIUM INTYBUS* L. Asteraceae.

Chicory.

No. 133. Near Mercedes, Uruguay.

162666. *CHLORIS REFUSA* Lag. Poaceae.

No. 114. Villa Nogués, near Tucumán, Argentina. Jan. 13, 1948. A low-growing perennial.

162667. *CITRULLUS VULGARIS* Schrad. Cucurbitaceae.

Watermelon.

No. 184. *Mendocina*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Very long fruits.

162668. *CUCUMIS MELO* L. Cucurbitaceae.

Muskmelon.

No. 178. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

162669 to 162671. *CUCURBITA MAXIMA* Duchesne. Cucurbitaceae.

Squash.

162669. No. 182. *Valenciano*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Fruits of medium size, rounded; skin bright-orange; flesh sweet and delicate, orange-yellow.

162670. No. 181. *Criollo*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Fruits rounded, of good keeping quality; flesh firm, of good flavor. Common type in markets.

162671. No. 175. *Forrajero*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Stems up to 20 feet long; leaves dark-green spotted with gray; fruits very large, up to 100 pounds in weight; flesh yellowish-white.

162672. *DESMANTHUS DEPRESSUS* Humb. & Bonpl. Fabaceae.

No. 132. Río Negro Valley near Mercedes, Uruguay. Plants about 1 foot high; profuse seeder.

162673. *DESMODIUM CANUM* (Gmel.) Schinz & Thell. Fabaceae.

No. 109. Moist grassy places between Perico and San Juancito, Jujuy Province, Argentina. Plants 6 to 12 inches high; abundant in pastures in this area.

162674. *DIGITARIA PHAEOTHRIX* (Trin.) Parodi. Poaceae.

No. 124. Montevideo, Uruguay. A large bunchgrass, leaves long and slender, rather tough; considered important as forage.
