162675. *HELIANTHUS ANNUUS* L. Asteraceae. Common sunflower.

No. 105. *Klein*. Enrique Klein Company, Tucumán, Argentina.

162676. *HIPPEASTRUM* sp. Amaryllidaceae.

No. 120. Humid foothills, 2,000- to 6,000-foot altitude, San Pedro near Tucumán, Argentina, in clay soil. Plants 18 to 24 inches high; flowers orange-brown.

162677. *LANTANA* sp. Verbenaceae.

No. 139. Near Mercedes, Uruguay. Shrublike, spreading, 2 feet high; flowers abundant.

162678. *LOLIUM MULTIFLORUM* Lam. Poaceae. Italian ryegrass.

No. 127. La Estanzuela Experiment Station, Uruguay. Profusely stooling, with as many as 100 offshoots; highly rust-resistant.

162679. *LYCOPERSICON ESCULENTUM* Mill. Solanaceae. Tomato.

No. 179. *Genova*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Wrinkled red fruits.

162680 to 162686. *PASPALUM* spp. Poaceae.

162680 to 162682. *PASPALUM DILATATUM* Poir. Dallis grass.

162680. No. 112. On grassy slopes at about 4,000 feet altitude, Anta Muerta, west of Tucumán, Argentina. The most important pasture species in this locality.

162681. No. 121. Sandy loam near Montevideo, Uruguay. Extra large seedheads.

162682. No. 125. On lawn, Museo Nacional, Montevideo, Uruguay. Seedheads large; sparsely stoolled.

162683. *PASPALUM PLICATULUM* Michx. Black grass.

No. 111. Grassy slope at Villa Nogués, near Tucumán, Argentina; altitude 4,000 feet.

162684. *PASPALUM NICORAE* Parodi.

No. 119. Southeast of Rivera, Uruguay.

162685. *PASPALUM PLICATULUM* Michx. Black grass.

No. 123. Montevideo, Uruguay. Jan. 20, 1948. An extra large strain.

162686. *PASPALUM* sp.

No. 138. Near Rivera, Uruguay. Jan. 22, 1948. Plants bluish-green, tough, about 18 inches high.

162687. *PAVONIA HASTATA* Cav. Malvaceae.

No. 134. In pure sand along Río de la Plata at Colonia, Uruguay. Jan. 26, 1948. Plant 3 feet high; flowers pink, about 1½ inches wide.

162688 and 162689. *PHASEOLUS LUNATUS* L. Fabaceae. Lima bean.

162688. No. 187. *Manteca Ramas*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Feb. 3, 1948.

162689. No. 180. *Manteca Enano*. Diharce and Company, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Feb. 3, 1948.

162690. *STIPA TUCUMANA* Parodi. Poaceae.

No. 110. Grassy slopes above Villa Nogués, near Tucumán, Argentina. Tufted perennial. Jan. 13, 1948.
