Elephant's foot.

No. A-170. Near Kalwerkop. Plant up to 3 feet tall; flowers yellow. (Tubers.)

196781 and 196782. *DIOSCOREA HEMICRYPTA* Burkill.

196781. No. A-168. Rocky slopes, Schoemanspoort. (Tubers.)

196782. No. A-167. Fifteen miles from Amaliestein at Huis River Pass. (Tubers.)

196783. *DIOSCOREA ELEPHANTIPES* (L'Herit.) Engl. **Elephant's foot.**

No. A-159. Seven miles east of Clanwilliam, at Pakhuis Pass, on sandstone boulders. (Tubers.)

196784. *DRIMIA* sp. Liliaceae.

No. A-155. Fifty-two miles south of Springbok, near Garies. In dry scrubby places.

196785. *FREESIA ELIMENSIS* L. Bolus. Iridaceae.

No. A-146. River Zonder, between Genadendal and Caledon. Flowers white with yellow center, fragrant.

196786. *HAEMANTHUS CALLOSUS* Burchell. Amaryllidaceae.

No. A-143. Between Genadendal and Caledon.

196787. *HAEMANTHUS* sp.

No. A-152. Nineteen miles north of Clanwilliam.

196788. *HAEMANTHUS* sp.

No. A-160. Seven miles east of Clanwilliam.

196789. *PERIPHANES ZEYHERI* (Baker) Leighton. Amaryllidaceae.

No. A-148. Along Oliphant's River between Citrusdal and Clanwilliam. Flowers pink, like those of a small Nerine.

196790. *LACHENALIA RUBIDA* Jacq. Liliaceae. **Cape-cowslip.**

No. A-166. Blauuberg Strand, north of Capetown. Showy red flowers.

196791. *LACHENALIA UNICOLOR* Jacq.

No. A-162. East of Clanwilliam.

196792. *MASSONIA* sp. Liliaceae.

No. A-157. South of Springbok.

196793. *NERINE* sp. Amaryllidaceae.

No. A-141. Du Toit's Pass, 24 miles west of Worcester. Pink flowers.

196794. *NERINE ANGUSTIFOLIA* Baker.

No. A-147. Near Genadendal. Flowers pink.

196795. *ORNITHOGALUM* sp. Liliaceae.

No. A-149. South of Clanwilliam.

196796. *SCILLA* sp. Liliaceae.

No. A-145. Between Genadendal and Caledon.

196797. *STRUMARIA RUBELLA* Jacq. Amaryllidaceae.

No. A-154. Twenty-eight miles north of Clanwilliam. Flowers white, appearing before leaves.
