Col. No. 452. Open meadow above Shibuyu Onsen, Nagano Prefecture. Elevation 780 meters. Biennial; flowers pale to dark purple, sometimes white to pink; 2 inches across.

235142. *SCHISANDRA CHINENSIS* (Turcz.) Baill. Magnoliaceae.

Chinese magnolia-vine.

Col. No. 467. Along road below Shibuyu Onsen, Yatsugatake Mountains, Nagano Prefecture. Elevation 1,500 meters. Vine; flowers whitish, in June; berries orange-red, in October.

Col. No. 462. At edge of fields, usually as understory, above Shibuyu Onsen. Elevation 1,850 meters. Small tree; foliage bright red, underside reddish-brown; fruits bright red.
