Col. No. E-449. Paramo of Cotopaxi between Latacunga and Quito. Elevation 3,750 meters. Tubers ellipsoid, about 3 cm. long; fruits ovoid, 2 cm. long.

Col. No. E-453. 'Jose Catota'. Vicinity of Saquisilí, Cotopaxi. Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers ellipsoid; skin purplish-red; eyes shallow; flesh creamy-white.

246983. SOLANUM sp.

Col. No. E-454. 'Tacanquilla'. Vicinity of Saquisilí, Cotopaxi, Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers ellipsoid; skin mottled with pink; eyes deep; flesh whitish.

246984. SOLANUM sp.

Col. No. E-455. 'Clavache'. Vicinity of Saquisilí, Cotopaxi. Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers banana-shaped; skin pink-bronze; eyes obscure; flesh yellowish-white.

246985. SOLANUM sp.

Col. No. E-456. 'Allco Chaqui'. Grown by Indians above Saquisilí, Cotopaxi. Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers reddish and purplish-black; flesh yellow.

246986. SOLANUM sp.

Col. No. E-457. 'Sole Blanca'. Vicinity of Saquisilí, Cotopaxi. Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers ellipsoid; skin white; eyes deep set; flesh whitish.

246987. SOLANUM sp.

Col. No. E-458. 'Olashuyo Negra'. Vicinity of Saquisilí, Cotopaxi. Elevation 3,000 meters. Tubers ellipsoid; skin purplish-black; eyes shallow; flesh whitish.

Col. No. E-452. From a native of Quito, who says they are 'Papás del Monte'.

Col. No. 21446. Broad, mottled leaves to 50 cm. long and 10 cm. wide.

246990. SANSEVIERIA sp.

Col. No. 21448. Leaves about 70 cm. long, canaliculate, and thick at the base.

246991. SANSEVIERIA sp.

Col. No. 21449. A terete-leaved species. Leaves to 1 meter long and 5 cm. in diameter.

246993. SECHIMUM EDULE (Jacq.) Sw. Cucurbitaceae. Chayote.

From Florida. Seeds presented by J. W. Lowe, Homestead. Received April 28, 1958.

From Greece. Seeds presented by the Agricultural Attache, Athens. Received April 3, 1958.
