247822. Col. No. 21150. Thirty km. north of Aba. Vine climbing on trees.

247823. Col. No. 21307. In lava fields 30 km. south of Rutshuru. Vine, looks like wild lima bean.

247824. *PHYSALIS PERUVIANA* L. Solanaceae. Peruvian groundcherry.

Col. No. 21207. 'Tambuac'. African market near Nioka. Fruits yellow-green, 15 mm. diameter, deep yellow inside; flavor good. Used commercially to make jam.

247825. *PHYSALIS* sp.

Col. No. 21232. Twenty five km. south of Lubero. Elevation 2,000 meters. Fruits resemble small tomatoes in size and taste, but are yellow at maturity and enclosed in papery bracts.
