('South Esk' × 'Shamrock') × 'Saranac'. 'South Esk' is a Scottish variety with resistance to leafroll virus, and field immunity to viruses A and X. It has never been grown commercially. 'Shamrock' is a red-skinned Irish variety with resistance to blight and leafroll. It is not grown commercially. 'Saranac' was bred in the United States and is grown in Australia on a small scale.

Plant tall, vigorous and upright; foliage medium green, curved downward; leaves large, sparsely pubescent; leaflets large, rugose when young, older primary leaflets domeshaped; flowers medium size, blue-heliotrope, light-tipped; calyx tips long pigmented, sparsely pubescent; tuber oval, somewhat flat; eyes shallow; skin usually white, but sometimes russeted and with faint pink flushes; flesh white.
